



**W**HEREAS it appears to the Commissioners appointed by a Commission under the Great Seal of Great Britain bearing date the 25th day of May, 1836, in pursuance of an Act of Parliament passed in the fifth and sixth Years of His Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act "for appointing Commissioners to continue the Inquiries "concerning Charities in England and Wales, until the "first day of March One Thousand Eight Hundred and "Thirty-seven," that the Property belonging to the Charity founded by *Sir Vincent Smith by deed dated 1626 For apprenticing one poor boy of Hungerford*

cousists only of *one* Annuity or Rent Charge not exceeding in the whole the yearly Sum of Fifty Pounds, that is to say, of an Annuity or Rent Charge of *twenty shillings* issuing out of *a messuage in Hungerford formerly the Green Dragon now belonging to Charles Alderman of Littlebury.*

And it further appears to the said Commissioners that there are no existing Trustees or Persons legally qualified to receive

and give an effectual Discharge for such Annuity or Rent Charge

Now We, whose Names are hereunto subscribed, being Five of the said Commissioners, do hereby in pursuance of the Power and Authority given to and vested in Us by the said Act, empower the resident Minister and the Church

or—Place—or—being one of the Parishes or Places—as the case may be.
